Memories from 10 Years of Mission Trips...

One of my great memories was from Haiti in November 2017. I realized the importance and impact of the local people to make the system sustainable long term. The trip was to a village near the Children's Lifeline school, church, and health clinic. We had tremendous support and commitment to the on-going operation and maintenance of the system. My first water purifier installation trip with Bill was to Cote-de-Fer, which is on the southern coast of Haiti. The sight of all the children helped me to realize just how important the work is that FoH does. The water purifier was going into a church/school setting. This memory comes from a trip to Kenya. The trip was to install two water purification systems. One for an elementary school where using the water was not only for the children but also to bless the community. The second system was at a high school where students are in class from 7 AM to 9 PM. The FoH system excited the principal because he knew there would be less lost class time from stomach illness.

At a school performance for the installation team, the final act was done by a boy of maybe 9 years old. He recited a poem done in Swahili about the mosquito and the personal fight of one boy against it. Brian recalls, "The whole thing was done with such conviction and passion with a contorted look of anger on his face that I thought this must be a very serious young man. When he was done, though, he went back to the group with the biggest smile on his face and looked just like any other nine year old. A movie director needs to find this kid." Brian McCall
